



## **Academic Support – Learning Lab**

The Learning Lab Program within the June Cooper Learning Center is responsible for providing curriculum support systems for students by coordinating and communicating with their classroom teachers, parents and the JCLC Team. There are several ways we achieve this which include, but are not limited to the following:

### **Providing Accommodation and Differentiation Support**

As all students are unique learners, the goal of the Learning Lab in the JCLC is to provide support for students that have existing learning accommodations, as well as the students who might struggle with a particular concept within a subject area. This is accomplished by small group instruction at the learning lab and/or within the students' classrooms. Those students without accommodations receive support based on communication between teachers, parents, and the JCLC team.

Some students with identified learning differences require testing support. Specific accommodations state that those students can complete their testing in the learning lab for a less distracting environment or extended time.

### **During the school day:**

- Small Group Testing - for students with accommodations (less distracting environment, extended time)
- One-on-one/small group academic support
- Bearcat Broadcast Elective – last period.

- Help with homework, print, use a computer

### **After School:**

- Open Monday–Thursday, 3:35-4:00
- After School Study Hall – Ursuline student help - no sign up required - Monday – Thursday 5<sup>th</sup> – 8<sup>th</sup> grades (cafeteria)
